

VETERAN ENGINEER TAKEN BY DEATH

Frederick Fahrenkamp Burial Services Pending

Funeral services for Frederick William Fahrenkamp, pioneer El Paso resident, today were pending the arrival of his daughter, Mrs. A. G. Webbeking, from Orange, Cal.

Mr. Fahrenkamp died suddenly at his home at 912 W. Missouri St. yesterday. He was 72.

For 52 years Mr. Fahrenkamp was employed by the Texas & Pacific Railroad. He was an engineer and made his run from Toyah to El Paso Wednesday afternoon as usual.

He was one of the oldest engineers in service in the southwest.

Mr. Fahrenkamp came to the United States from Germany when he was 17 years old. He was born in Isenstedt, Germany, Aug. 21, 1864.

Mr. Fahrenkamp was a member of the St. Paul's Lutheran Church. He belonged to the Brotherhood of Locomotive Enginemen.

Surviving him are: his widow, Mrs. Augusta Fahrenkamp, El Paso; two daughters, Mrs. A. G. Webbeking, Orange, Cal., and Mrs. H. C. Horsley, El Paso; a brother W. F. Fahrenkamp, El Paso, and a sister, Mrs. L. Herman, Strawn.
