

Miss Falvey, Of Pioneer Family, Dies

Miss Mabel Falvey, member of a pioneer El Paso family, died in a local hospital, Saturday.

Miss Falvey was born at Ysleta when it was the county seat of El Paso County.

She was the daughter of the late Thomas A. Falvey, district judge in the pioneer days of El Paso.

Miss Falvey attended grade and high school in El Paso. She graduated from Texas University after three years of study, and was a member of Phi Beta Kappa national scholastic honorary society.

Following her graduation, Miss Falvey returned here and taught in El Paso High School for several years. She later mastered shorthand and took examinations for court reporter. She was appointed to the 65th District Court in 1917 and remained there until 1945.

For the past years she was reporter in the County Court-at-Law.

She is survived by her mother, Mrs. Thomas A. Falvey, and a sister, Mrs. Lena Lynch, both of the Lower Valley.

Funeral services will be held in the Kaster and Maxon Chapel at 10:30 a. m. Monday with the Rev. B. M. G. Williams officiating. Burial will be in Evergreen Cemetery.
