

# MRS. FEWEL'S BURIAL TODAY

## Pioneer Resident Dies Here After Being Ill Two Months

Funeral services for Mrs. Euphemia Carrie Fewel, pioneer El Paso resident, were to be held from the home of her daughter, Mrs. J. Frank Coles, 3010 Gold St., at 2:30 p. m. today. Rev. L. L. Evans was to officiate and burial was to be in Evergreen under direction of Peak-Hagedon Mortuary. The family has requested that no flowers be sent.

Mrs. Fewel died last night after an illness of two months. She was 88.

Mrs. Fewel had lived in El Paso since 1881. She was born in Lexington, Mo., Sept. 12, 1848. She was married to the late Major W. J. Fewel, Dec. 18, 1872.

She was a charter member of Trinity Methodist Church and was an honorary member of the Pan-American Roundtable Assn., the Pioneer Assn., and the Robert E. Lee Chapter of the U. D. C.

Mrs. Fewel and her husband built the second frame house in El Paso. The building, erected in 1882 at 917 E. San Antonio St., still is used as a residence by Mrs. Fewel's son, Edgar D. Fewel.

Mrs. Fewel is survived by her daughter and two sons, C. C. and Edgar D. Fewel, all of El Paso; two sisters, Mrs. D. R. Metcalf, Blackburn, Mo., and Mrs. J. M. Baldwin, La Mont, Mo.
