

Funeral Services For Pioneer Are Set For Tuesday

Funeral services for William Neal Fleck, 74, who died here Saturday afternoon, will be held Tuesday afternoon at 4 o'clock at the Peak-Hagedorn chapel.

Mr. Fleck was a native of Sarnia, Ontario, Canada. He came to the upper valley about 40 years ago and purchased a ranch near Berino, N. M. His bride, Miss Ida McCain, whom he married at Fort Worth, came with him. After operating the New Mexico ranch for some years, Mr. Fleck bought a ranch at Newman. Twenty-three years ago he purchased the ranch at Orogrande, which he owned at the time of his death.

Mr. Fleck was a member of the Southwestern Cattleman's association and was active in the interests of the cattle industry.

In addition to his home at the ranch, Mr. Fleck had a home in the city and he spent his time between the two. He managed his ranch up until the time of his death.

Mr. Fleck was a Mason and a member of the Presbyterian church. Surviving him are his widow; three sons, Ralph and Walter, El Paso, and Howard of Oakland, Calif.; two daughters, Mrs. F. J. Clark of El Paso and Mrs. Dema Lewis of Indianapolis.
