

Alexander Foster Taken by Death

Alexander Gwyn Foster, president of the Foster Abstract Co., died in Los Angeles, yesterday. He was 60.

His father, the late Judge A. G. Foster, settled in El Paso in the 1880s, and was one of the pioneer attorneys here. His mother was the former Frances Baylor.

Mr. Foster attended the Kentucky Military Institute, and received a law degree from the University of Kentucky. He was in service in World War I.

The Foster Abstract Co. was founded by Mr. Foster in 1931. His father had started an abstracting business before him, but he started his own concern.

Mr. and Mrs. Foster left for the West Coast two years ago. He returned to El Paso frequently to attend to his business.

He became ill two months ago.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Myrtle V. Foster; a brother, H. Baylor Foster of California; three sisters, Mrs. Francis B. Svensen, Mrs. Emily Baird and Mrs. Catharine Merriweather, all of California; a stepdaughter, Margaret F. Schraut of Denver, Colo.; and an aunt, Mrs. Catherine Loeser of San Francisco.
