

# Henry Gordon Frost Taken By Death

## He Was Organizer Of Gas Company

Funeral arrangements will be held tomorrow for Henry Gordon Frost, Houston oil and cattleman, and former prominent El Paso business organizer, who died yesterday after an operation. He was 51.

Mr. Frost organized the El Paso Natural Gas Co., in 1928 and served as its vice president and general manager until 1936. He lived here most of that period. He was a director of the El Paso National Bank.

Mr. Frost held directorships in both organizations at the time of his death.

He also was organizer and president of the Havana Oil Co., the Coast-Wide Oil Co., and the Occidental Royalty Co. He was a partner in Frost and Dunnam, Inc., which he operated with his son-in-law.

Returning to Houston in 1933, Mr. Frost organized several oil companies which now have holdings in the West Columbia field, the Cordell field in Jackson County, the Hull field in Chambers County, the Hastings field and in other parts of Texas and Louisiana. He had resided in Houston before he came here in 1928 and was a native of that city.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Nell Frost; a daughter, Mrs. W. D. Dunnam; a son, Henry Gordon Frost Jr.; his mother, Mrs. J. M. Frost; a sister, Mrs. Annie B. Belstrom; three brothers, J. M., C. M., and Vernon W. Frost, and two granddaughters, Sandra and Diana Dudley Dunnam, all of Houston.

Paul Kayser, president of the gas company which Mr. Frost organized, and Sam D. Young, El Paso National Bank president, flew to Houston last night to attend the funeral.
