

# MRS. I. G. GAAL DIES SUDDENLY

Mrs. I. G. Gaal, 63 years old, died suddenly at her home at Old Fort Bliss Tuesday night. She was ill but 15 minutes. When she was stricken a physician was summoned but Mrs. Gaal died before he reached her home.

Mrs. Gaal was born in Williamantic, Conn., and spent her early girlhood there. At the age of 21, in 1878, she was married to Mr. Gaal. Seven children were born to them, of which four are living. The three sons are Frank, Charles and George Gaal, all of El Paso. A daughter, Mrs. Lillian Aden, made her home with her parents. Mr. Gaal also survives. He was at one time superintendent of the old county hospital and 25 years ago was prominent in El Paso politics.

He has been a lifelong Republican and was one of the militants in years past.

The Gaals were pioneer residents of El Paso county, living at Ysleta when that place was the county seat.

Funeral arrangements have not been made, but it is planned to place the body in a receiving vault, pending arrangements for burial in Los Angeles, Calif.
