

Pat Garrett's Widow Dies

Pioneer New Mexico Woman Succumbs At Las Cruces.

Las Cruces, N. M., Oct. 21.—Mrs. Pauline Garrett, 75, widow of the late Pat F. Garrett, famous New Mexico sheriff who slew the notorious Billy the Kid, died here at 5:30 p. m. Wednesday following a brief illness.

Mrs. Garrett had made her home in Las Cruces since 1900. She was born in Las Vegas, N. M. in 1861, the daughter of one of the first settlers of the area.

Her survivors include four children, Elizabeth Garrett, Roswell, N. M.; Pauline Garrett, Las Cruces; Jarvis Garrett, of Mexico City, and Oscar Garrett, Kingston, Ariz.; and three grandchildren, Ralph and Aizina Montgomery, El Paso, and Edward Montgomery, Hobbs, N. M.

Funeral arrangements for the pioneer New Mexican were pending Wednesday night at the Las Cruces Mortuary.
