

D. J. Gasherie.

Our esteemed fellow citizen, Col. D. J. Gasherie, who peacefully passed away at his residence, 311 Missouri street, Sunday morning at about half-past one o'clock, was buried from the Presbyterian church yesterday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. The church was pretty well filled with the friends and acquaintances of the family. Rev. C. A. Hyland, the pastor of the church, conducted the services, reading selections from scripture appropriate to the occasion, and giving a short discourse on the doctrine of the resurrection of the body, and the meeting of Christians with one another in heaven. Two hymns were sung by the choir and congregation. As the body was borne to its resting place before the pulpit the choir sang a beautiful and touching selection, and as the friends of the dead were passing by the bier, to take a last look at the familiar countenance that lay calm and placid in death, Miss Marie Shelton sang a solo that brought tears to many eyes. The remains were laid to rest in the Presbyterian burying ground in Evergreen Cemetery. The earth as it fell on the coffin lid, in accompaniment with the solemn words, spoken by the minister, "Earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust," reminded all present that the form of a friend and loved one, was to be bid from view till the morning of resurrection. Col. Gasherie had lived the allotted period of human existence - three score and ten years. He was a consistent member of the Presbyterian church, was a good citizen, as devoted friend, a loving husband and father, and honorable and upright man. His death is a great loss to this community.
