

Arrange Rites For Dr. Robert H. Geer

Funeral services for Dr. Robert H. Geer, a prominent El Paso physician for nearly a quarter of a century, will be conducted tomorrow in Kaster and Maxon Chapel at 4:15 p. m. Burial will be in Restlawn.

Dr. Geer died yesterday in his Upper Valley home after an illness of six months. He practiced medicine in El Paso 24 years. He was 55.

Born in Sparta, Tenn., Dr. Geer came to Texas as a child, later returning to Tennessee to graduate from Pleasant Hill Academy.

Dr. Geer also attended school at Polytechnic Institute in Fort Worth, and was graduated from Texas School of Medicine at Galveston, in 1913.

A member of the El Paso County Medical Society, Dr. Geer also was a member of Fraternity Lodge No. 1111, A. F. and A. M. and was a past president of the El Paso Archery Club. He also was a past president of the Farm Bureau at White Spur in the Upper Valley.

Surviving Dr. Geer are: his widow, Mrs. Minnie Lee Geer; two stepsons, Newel and Leslie Hays; two daughters, Mrs. Dean Earp of El Paso and Mrs. Jim Derrick of Carlsbad, N. M.; a sister, Mrs. Fred L. Fox, and a niece, Miss Betty Joe Fox, both of El Paso; six grandchildren, Robert and Edwina Lee Price, Marian Alice and Minnie Lee Earp, Raymond and Leslie Hays, all of El Paso; his step-mother, Mrs. Alice Hawkins; a half-brother, Aron Hawkins, and two half-sisters, Mrs. J. E. Hall and Miss Pearl Hawkins, all of Shawnee, Okla.
