

MORRIS GIESBERG CLAIMED BY DEATH

Old Timer Passes Away and is Said to Have Been Robbed After Death.

Morris Geisberg, 60 years old, died in his home on Utah street Wednesday. He had lived in El Paso 16 years and during that entire time had been engaged in the transfer business. He had prospered financially and owned considerable real estate in El Paso, including the house in which he died.

He had no relatives in El Paso, but leaves a son and a daughter in Arkansas. Before he came to El Paso he was purchasing agent for the Cotton Belt railway.

El Paso lodge No. 82, Knights of Pythias, of which the deceased was a member, will conduct the funeral services at 3 o'clock Friday afternoon. The burial will be in the plot in Concordia cemetery belonging to the local Jewish synagogue, with which Mr. Geisberg was affiliated.

Upon complaint of a negro named Johnson, who has been employed by Geisberg, two Mexicans, Serapio Jaramillo and Juan Leon, were arrested today by officer Franco, charged with rifling the pockets of the deceased after his death, and securing over \$60. Warrants were sworn out against them, charging them with theft from the person, in justice Marshall's court, and they were transferred to the county jail by constable Clements to await a hearing.
