

Pioneer El Pasoan Dies on Coast

Word has been received of the death of Emile R. Gemoets, pioneer El Pasoan, who died recently in Los Angeles. He was 76.

Mr. Gemoets was born in Montague, Belgium, and came to El Paso in 1884. He was owner and operator of the old Belgian Bakery in El Paso for many years.

Mr. Gemoets was a World War I veteran, a member of the El Paso Disabled American Veterans and the American Legion. He was employed as mail carrier in Ysleta for many years.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Julia Gemoets of Ysleta; four sons, Edward E. Gemoets of San Diego, Albert B. Gemoets of Hot Springs, N. M., Ensign Emile Gemoets Jr. of New York and Sgt. Frank Gemoets of Harlingen; one daughter, Mrs. Annie Najara of El Paso; two brothers, Leon L. Gemoets of El Paso and Joseph E. Gemoets of WALTERIA, Cal.; two sisters, Mrs. Emma Krause and Sister Adeline of Denver, and seven grandchildren.

Burial was in the National Cemetery in Los Angeles.
