At Silver City, on Tuesday, March 14, 1893, at 3 o'clock p. m., Mrs. Muttle Gillett, wife of S. B. Gillett, aged twenty three years and twenty-two days. At a few minutes past three o'clock on Tuesday last, the people of Silver City were shocked by the report of the death of Mrs. Gillett, from hysteria, superinduced by nervous weakness after childbirth. An air of saduess reemed to pervade the town as soou as the report gained circulation. The lady was highly esteemed by a very large circle of friends and acquaint ances for her many domestic and social virtues. Her kind and ever pleasant demeanor towards all whom she met, rendered her a general favorite in social circles, to which she was a necessity as well as an orniment. She was a fond mother, a tender, true and devoted wife; and loving sister to the orphaned children, bereaved husband and desolated brother who are here left to mourn her loss. They have the sympathy of everyone in this great tribulation which has befallen them. The funeral took place from the family residence on Wednesday. The beautiful funeral services were conducted under the auspices of the Knights of Pythias, of which order Mr. Gillett is a m mber. Every token of respect possible was shown the deceased and her family. The banks and all other business houses closed at noon and remained closed till 4 o'clock p. m. The funeral cortege was one of the largest ever seen in Silver City -Silver City Enterprise.
