Veteran El Paso Judge Succumbs Following Operation On Sunday.

Widow and Three Children Survive Prominent Attorney.

JAMES MANN GOGGIN, 62. pioneer El Paso attorney, died in Hotel Dieu at 10:30 o'clock last night following an operation performed Sunday. He had suffered with intestinal trouble and appendicitis.

Judge Goggin, a member of the legal firm of Goggin, Hunter & Brown, was born October 29, 1804, in Campbell county, Virginia. His father was Brig. Gen. James Monroe Goggin of the Confederate army. His mother was Elizabeth Nelson Page Goggin of the illustrious Page Goggin of Texas with his parents in his youth, Judge Goggin was reared in Austin. After attending private schools he received his college from 1881 to '83, and the University of Texas, where he was a member of Kappa Alpha fraternity. Judge Goggin was a member of Kappa Alpha fraternity. Judge Goggin was a member of the first class organized after the university was founded. He was graduated from the law department in 1887.

After finishing the law course, Judge Goggin macheed for a number of years in Eagly Pass, where he held the position of county indee from 1890 to 186.

In 1894 innige Goggir married Miss Lilla Hatfield Singson of Eagle Pass, Mrs. Goggif survives him as do his mother, two sisters, three children and one grandchild.

Judge Goggin was a member of the State Democratic Executive committee for a number of years prior to 1900, in which year he was named a delegate to the National Democratic convention in Kansas City.

Domocratic convention in kansas City:
In 1899 Judge Goggin was appointed judge of the Forty-first Judicial district, which at that time extended from Eagle Page to El Pago. His duties on the hence brought him to El Pago, and in 1997 or 1995, he brought his family here to make their house. their home.

Judge Goggin was subsequently elected to the Forty-first district court judgeship for a number of

The family home for the last 20 years has been at 1224 Magoffin avenue.

After leaving the hench Judge Gog-gin formed a law partnership with Waters Davis. The firm of Goggin, Hunter and Brown was formed seven

Always prominent in his profession, Judge Goggin was at one time president of the local har association. During the war he served on the legal board of advisors which had charge of draft regulations.

He was also at one time chairman of the board of directors of the Border National bank, in 1923 Judge Goggin was honored by membership in the El-Paso County Pioneers' association. He was a cousin of the late Judge Wyndham Kemp of El-Paso.
