

Pioneer Woman Taken by Death

Mrs. Emma Ullman Goldstein died at a hospital early today after a long illness. She was the wife of the late A. H. Goldstein, attorney in the firm of Grambling, Hardie and Jones.

Mrs. Goldstein's death came less than a month after that of her sister, Mrs. Clotilde Fatman of Los Angeles. Mrs. Fatman had come to El Paso to be with Mrs. Goldstein during her illness. Mrs. Fatman was stricken with a heart attack and died Nov. 16.

Mrs. Goldstein resided with her sister, Mrs. Ben Levy of 1001 East Robinson boulevard. She had been a resident of El Paso for 63 years, coming here as a child in 1889.

She was prominent in early El Paso music, social and dramatic circles. For many years, she was a soloist in the First Presbyterian Church and at Mt. Sinai Temple.

Survivors include Mrs. Levy; a brother, Sidney Ullman of El Paso; a niece, Mrs. Stuart Greenberg of San Francisco; and a nephew, Maurice Blumenthal of Los Angeles.
