

RESIDENT OF SOUTHWEST SINCE 1895, IS DEAD

Lewis Goodman, a resident of the southwest since 1895, died Monday at his home, 611 Prospect avenue.

Mr. Goodman was in business in El Paso for a number of years, first being connected with the American Grocery company and later establishing the Western Grocery company and the Rio Grande Fuel company. He was also in business in New Mexico and prior to that lived in New York.

He was acquainted with the late Theodore Roosevelt and was a personal friend of senator A. B. Fall.

He was a member of the Odd Fellows, Woodmen of the World, Eagles, Sons of Herman and the congregation of B'Nai Zion.

Those surviving are his widow, four children and six brothers. The children are David, Esther, Sara and Josephine. The brothers are Joe H., Herbert, Isaac, Jacob and Samuel, all of El Paso.
