

PASSING OF AN OLD PLAINSMAN.

**After a Long Life of Thrilling Adventures
He Gave Up the Struggle.**

Francis A. Goodrich of Cincinnati, aged 67 years, and an old veteran of the union army, died in this city yesterday of quick consumption, and will be buried from the Caldwell Undertaking parlors at 2:30 this afternoon. The old veteran will be interred beside the body of his wife, who was buried in Evergreen cemetery on the 19th of June last.

Deceased leaves two daughters, Mrs. L. A. Meader, residing near the Towne smelter, and Mr. Moore of Deming, and a stepson, Andrew Foley of this city.

Mr. Goodrich was an old plainsman, having spent several years of his early manhood, prior to the war between the states, on the then uninhabited plains of Wyoming, Colorado and South Dakota. On the breaking out of the war between the states he returned to the white settlements and enlisted in the union army, in which he served until the close of the war. He was a man of strong individuality, and was sometimes accounted "cranky" among casual acquaintances, but he was a deep thinker and a man of sound judgment.
