DR. GOULD DROPS DEAD ON STREET

Well Known Former El Pasoan Dies Suddenly in Albuquerque

Albuquerque. N. M., Nov. 20.—Dr. J. T. Gould, 65 years old, one of the most widely known newspapermen in New Mexico antil a few years ago, dropped dead shortly after noon today. He was seen to stagger and fall and was carried into a nearby store, where he died a few minutes later. Heart failure was the probable cause of death.

Dr. Gould many years ago was head of a Methodist female college in Millersburg, Ky. He came from Kentucky to the west. He was for a time pastor at Las Vegas and then went to El Paso to

engage in newspaper work.

He was at various times editorial writer on the El Paso News, Albuquerque Citizen, Albuquerque Journal-Democrat, Las Vegas Optic and several New Mexico papers.

He has a son, Robin, now on the El Paso Herald, in the circulation depart-

ment.

Dr. Gould, who dropped dead at Albuquerque Monday afternoon, was well known to many El Pascans. He lived here for a number of years and his children attended school here. Robin Gould graduated from the El Pasc high school as valedictorian of his class. He is now connected with the business department of the El Pasc Herald. Dr. Gould and family left El Pasc about four years ago, to go to Albuquerque.

When Trinity Methodist church was dedicated in El Paso (the old Trinity church that stood on the southwest corner of Texas and Stanton streets) Dr. Gould, then pastor at Las Vegas came here to preach the dedicatory sermon.
