Rosary services for Miss Annie Grady, of 209 W. Rio Grande Ave., a retired El Paso schoolteacher who died Friday, will be held at 8 p.m. Sunday in the Harding-Orr and McDaniel Chapel. Funeral mass will be said in St. Patrick's Cathedral at 9 a.m., Monday with the Rev. G. W. Cafery officiating. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery.

Miss Grady was a pioneer Pasoan, arriving here in 1879. She started teaching school in the El Paso Public schools about 1880 at Aoy School. Later she taught at Alamo and Beall Schools and became principal of Franklin School in 1920. She retired in 1948.

Miss Grady was born in Ft. Worth and came to El Paso with her parents and uncles who were the contractors who built the roadbed for the railroads which came to El Paso in 1881. She was a member of St. Patrick's Cathedral Pioneer Women's Association, Retired Teachers Association, Ladies of Charity, Altar Society and Texas Western Alumni. Her brother, was the late P. H. Grady, who was deputy collector of Customs in El Paso. Survivors include a sister, Mrs. Albert T. Mueller, nephews and nieces, Mrs. L. R. Shea, Bill Mueller, Albert Mueller, all of El Paso; Dan Mueller of Albuquerque, N.M., Henry and Robert Grady, of Los Angeles, Calif., Hugh Dugan of Bisbee, Ariz., and William Grady of Ft. Worth.
