
Rosary services are scheduled

SHE WAS THE widow of the late U.S. Dist. Judge Ernest Guinn. She was a graduate of Texas College of Mines.

Mrs. Guinn was member of the Texas State Bar Assn., El Paso County Bar Assn. the Altrusa Club, Business and Professional Woman's Club, and an honorary member of Delta Kappa Gamma, a national fraternity of women educators. She was named Outstanding Ex-Student of Texas Western in 1957.

MRS. GUINN met her husband when she was a teacher at Aoy School, She studied law while being a housewife and mother of six, and was admitted to the Texas State Bar Assn. in 1950. She was admitted to practice law in U.S. District Court in 1951 by the late

Judge R. E. Thomason and was at that time the second El Paso woman to be accorded the privilege.

The late Judge Guinn, appointed to the bench by the late President Lyndon Johnson in 1966, died in June of 1974.
