

J. W. Hambleton, Pioneer, Is Claimed By Death In Mexico

Advices have been received of the death in Parral, Mexico, of James W. Hambleton, after an illness of several months. Mr. Hambleton was widely known in Mexico and El Paso and leaves a large circle of friends. He was born in London, Eng., on March 29, 1864, and spent the early years of his life in the merchant service.

He came to Kendall county, Texas, in 1882. From there he went to Mexico and has been associated with the Madera interests and the Torreon smelter up to the time of his death. His family has been living in El Paso since 1912.

He leaves his wife, Margarita F. de Hambleton, three sons, James, John and Henry, a sister, Mrs. Harold D. Higgins of El Paso, and a brother, Herbert of Guanacevi, Mex.
