

B. Hagedon Rosary Rites Set Monday

Rosary services for Barry Hagedon, 69, prominent El Pasoan and Southwestern sportsman, who died Saturday morning, will be held in Martin Mortuary Chapel at 8 p. m. Monday.

Funeral mass will be said at 10 a. m. Tuesday in St. Patrick's Cathedral. Burial will be in Evergreen Cemetery.

Mr. Hagedon, a resident of El Paso since 1907, was born in Dallas, Texas, Aug. 23, 1885. He attended schools there and later was graduated from the Barnes School of Embalming in Chicago.

In 1919 he formed a partnership with John W. Peak and founded the Peak-Hagedon Funeral Home. In 1942 he purchased the interest of Peak and changed the name to the Barry Hagedon Funeral Home.

He retired in October of 1946, after selling the funeral home to Russ Harding.

Active in civic affairs, Mr. Hagedon was a past president of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce, and past exalted ruler of the Elks Lodge. He was also a member of the Rotary Club and belonged to several other civic organizations. He was a member of St. Patrick's Cathedral.

His chief hobbies were racing greyhounds, some of which were

nationally famous runners. He was also an adrent baseball fan, and played semi-pro baseball.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ann Hagedon, and one brother, Ramsey Hagedon of Dallas, who is in El Paso to attend the funeral.
