

Mrs. Hagedon To Be Buried On Monday

Mrs. Esther Louise Hagedon, 54, 320 Montana Street, resident of El Paso for more than 40 years and identified with civic and charitable activities, died in a local hospital Saturday after a long illness.

She was a member of the Woman's Club, the W. B. A. Review No. 42 and numerous other clubs, organized and sponsored for charitable and social purposes.
