## LOUIS HAMMER IS DEAD: OLD TIMER

## One of City's Best Known Contractors and Property Owner

Louis Hammer, one of the oldest residents of this city and a well known contractor, died at four oclock this morning at a local hospital after having undergone an operation Saturday for peritonitie. He was generally respected by all withw hom he had any connections and one business and of the city stated this morning that Mr. Hammer was one of the squarest and biggest hearted men that he ever khow.

Hammer is survived by a wife, three daughters, Mrs. Frieds Fickee, of Lake Zurick III; Mrs. Richard Keays; who resides about five miles down the valley from Jugges, and one other daughter, two sons Joe of Fort Rayard. New Mexico, and Will, of Alhamber, Arisons, Mrs. Hammer is at present III at the home of Mrs. Bowlder on the corner of Wyoming and North Oregon streets.
