## El Pasoan was golf instructor

Jack Harden, a golf teacher who was inducted into the El Paso Sports Hall of Fame and who built the six-iron that Alan Shepard used in the historic Apollo 14 moon shot, died Saturday (Aug. 30, 1997). He was 84 years old and lived in San Antonio.

He was the Head Professional of the Valdespino Municipal Golf Course and the El Paso Country Club. He also designed and built the Horizon Golf Course. In 1952 and 1954, Harden won the Texas PGA Championship and in 1964 he won the Mile-Hi Open.

Survivors include his sons, Jack Edward Harden and Thomas Fields Harden; his brother, Dan Harden; his sister, Mary Harden Belser; four grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife, Sarah Fields.

Chapel service will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday in Harding-Orr and McDaniel Funeral Home-Montana. Graveside service will be in Memory Gardens of the Valley Cemetery.
