

Mrs. Hardie, Church Leader, Dies At 74

Funeral services for Mrs. Bradford Hardie, 74, who died at 10:30 a. m. Thursday of a heart attack, will be held at 11:30 a. m. Saturday in Barry Hagedorn Funeral Home chapel. Services at Evergreen Cemetery will be attended by the family only. The Rev. Paul N. Poling, pastor of First Presbyterian Church, will conduct both services.

Mrs. Hardie was born in Marion, Ala., Aug. 10, 1869. She and Mr. Hardie, who died 15 years ago, came here from Montgomery, Ala., in 1898.

During her lifetime, Mrs. Hardie was active in church work. She was an outstanding member of the First Presbyterian Church, of which she had been a member for 10 years. Prior to that, Mrs. Hardie was a member of Westminster Presbyterian Church. She was also an active member of the Woman's Club.

Ten years ago, Mrs. Hardie was elected president of El Paso Chapter of the W. C. T. U. Mrs. Hardie also served as secretary of the Robert E. Lee Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy.

Surviving are four sons, Thornton Hardie and LeBron Hardie, of El Paso; James Hardie, of Tucson, and Bradford Hardie, of Dallas, who will be here for the funeral; ~~five daughters, Mrs. H. H.
