George F. Hawks, 77, Taken
By Death in California

George F. Hawks, former vice president and general manager of the old El Paso and Southwestern Railroad, died at his home in Los Angeles, last night. He was 77.

Mr. Hawks came to El Paso in 1907 as general superintendent of the E. P. & S. W. He was made vice-president and general manager in 1916. He was retired in 1919 and was succeeded by the late A. E. Sweet.

Before coming to El Paso, Mr. Hawks was connected with the Houston and Texas Central Railroad with headquarters in Houston.

He had lived in Los Angeles most of the time since his retirement. He is survived by two brothers living in Portland, Ore. Death was due to complications induced by advanced age.
