

FUNERAL RITES HELD FOR VALLEY PIONEER

Mrs. Minnie Hibbert, Canutillo,
Came to El Paso in 1881

Funeral services for Mrs. Minnie May Hibbert, 60, were held in the Kaster & Maxon chapel, with Rev. B. M. G. Williams officiating. Burial was in the family plot at Evergreen cemetery.

Mrs. Hibbert succumbed to a heart attack after an illness of a week.

She had been a resident of Canutillo for 25 years. She came to El Paso in 1881 and moved to Canutillo in 1912.

Her activities in community work in the upper valley were many. She was a member of St. Luke's Episcopal church and the Aladdin club.

Mrs. Hibbert is survived by her husband, James Hibbert; three sons, Charles and James Hibbert of Canutillo, and Richard L. Hibbert, Atlanta, Ga.; and a sister, Mrs. Bessie Luthy, El Paso, and four grandchildren.
