

Mrs. J. Hilton's Long Illness Proves Fatal

Funeral services were held in Los Angeles Thursday for Mrs. Joseph Hilton, member of prominent El Paso families, who died after a long illness at her home in California, according to information received here Friday by friends and relatives.

A daughter, Miss Josephine Hilton, was recently a guest at a Los Angeles reception for three generations of the family.

Mrs. Hilton was also related to C. N. Hilton, operating the Hilton Hotel chain.
