

# MOTHER OF THE HACKETT BOYS IS DEAD

Two Well Known Santa Fe  
Engineers in El Paso Be-  
reaved by Death.

Mrs. Salina Hockett, the mother of Will and Sid Hockett, well known Santa Fe engineers who live in El Paso, died at San Marcial, N. M., at six o'clock Thursday evening after an illness of a week. Mrs. Hockett, or "Grandma" Hockett as she was known to everyone in San Marcial, was 78 years old at the time of her death and she leaves six children, including the two popular Santa Fe engineers who have been making their homes in El Paso since the change in the operation of the Santa Fe trains which necessitated the layover here instead of at San Marcial.

"Grandma" Hockett was one of the best known women of San Marcial and was a pioneer of the territory. She was a member of the Methodist church, having been in the active service of the church since her youth. Her sons, Will, Sid and Frank, were with her at the time of her death as was also Mrs. Jennie Banks, a daughter who lives in San Marcial.

Her son, Will, was the first man to run a passenger train over the El Paso division of the Santa Fe and he and his brother, Sid, are two of the best known railroaders on the entire Santa Fe system. The arrangements for the funeral of the pioneer woman have not yet been announced but they will probably be held from the Methodist church at San Marcial where Mrs. Hockett had attended worship for years.
