THOMAS HUDSON, DEMING PIONEER, CLAIMED BY DEATH

One of Odest and Most Respected Citizens Dies at Advanced Age of 78.

Deming, N. M., June 5.—Thomas R. Hudson, one of the pioneers of Deming and southern New Mexico, and who was for years prominently identified with the development and upbuilding of Luna county and Deming, died here at the advanced age of 78 years. Mr. Hudson was a Mason of high degree, serving as tyler of the local Masonic bodies for the past 14 years. His funeral was held Thursday, burial being under the auspices of the Masonic lodge. The deceased for years conducted what is now Faywood hot springs, the springs then being known as Hudson hot springs. He also was for many years extensively engaged in mining operations in southwestern New Mexico.
