Henry Philip Huff Taken by Death At Age of 60

Henry Philip Huff, vice president and treasurer of The White House, died early today in his sleep at his home at 3107 Wheeling street. He was 60.

Mr. Huff suffered an attack of indigestion Friday, and had another attack late yesterday.

Born in Jones County, Mississippi, Dec. 29, 1884, he came to El Paso 35 years ago. He started work with the White House in 1912 as a bookkeeper. He became credit manager in 1924, secretary of the corporation in 1933, and was made vice president and treasurer in 1943.

Mr. Huff was married in 1912 to Miss Eva Mae Burnside of Ellisville, Miss., who survives him. They have two sons, Henry P. Huff Jr., of Buffalo, N. Y., aeronautical engineer with the Curtiss-Wright Corp., and Lieut. James S. Huff of Roswell.

Other survivors are two grandsons, Henry P. Huff III and J. S. Huff Jr., and a sister, Mrs. J. H. Crawford of Laurel, Miss.

Mr. Huff belonged to the National Retail Credit Men's Assn. He was a member of the Baptist Church.
