Death Claims Judge Hunter

Pioneer El Paso Lawyer Dies In Home After Month's Illness.

Judge F. E. Hunter, 73, pioneer El Paso attorney and a member of the firm, Hunter, Brown and Brooke, died late last night at his home, 212 Montana street, following an illness of several weeks.

Coming to El Paso in 1883 following graduation from the University of Indiana, Judge Hunter became connected with the firm of Hunter, Bailey and Foster. He was the last of that firm, which practiced law here in the late eighties and early mineties, John Bailey and A. G. Foster having preceded him in death.

Was County Judge.

Judge Hunter was licensed to practice before the supreme courts of Texas and the United States. He was a past county attorney and county judge of El Paso county.

His present partners were Volney

M. Brown and J. C. Brooke.

He was a Mason and an Odd Fellow.

Besides his widow, Mrs. Minnie E. Hunter, he is survived by a son, Herbert H. Hunter, of 3127 Montana street; two brothers, George D. Hunter, of Los Angeles, and Paul Hunter, of Madison, Wis., and two sisters, Miss Lucy Hunter, of Bloomington, Ind., and Mrs. Nora Applegate, of Grand Rapids, Mich.

Judge Hunter became ill March 28 and never recovered. Funcral ar-

rangements are pending.
