

DEATH OF MRS. O. C. IRVIN THIS MORNING EARLY

**One of City's Best Known
and Best Loved Women
Passes Away, After a Lin-
gering Illness.**

Elizabeth McMillan Irvin, 54 years old, wife of Dr. O. C. Irvin, died early this morning in her home, 716 San Antonio street. The funeral will take place from the First Methodist church at 3 o'clock Friday afternoon. The interment will be in Evergreen cemetery.

Mrs. Irvin was one of the best known and best loved women in the city and had lived here for years, having located here in the early eighties with her husband. She was the mother of Dr. E. H. and Miss Hallie Irvin, both of whom were with her at the time of her death. She had been in poor health for a long time and had been confined to her bed for several weeks, but was a patient sufferer and bore it all with Christian fortitude.

She was a leading Christian worker and was identified with all charitable and benevolent enterprises of the city during her entire residence here. She was a devout member of the First Methodist church, having been one of its first members, and was identified with all the auxiliary organizations of that body, helping all the time to extend the sphere of its influence.

As a member of the Women's club she was always one of its leading workers and was actively engaged in an endeavor to bring about the best results for humanity in all its work. She was the president of the organization at one time and never in its history did it accomplish more than during the time of her incumbency of that office.
