

DR. ORLANDO IRVIN IS DEAD

One of El Paso's Pioneer
Physicians Succumbs to
Bright's Disease.

PRACTICED MEDICINE
LOCALLY 29 YEARS

Deceased Was One of the
Founders of the First
Methodist Church.

DR. ORLANDO C. IRVIN, aged 62 years, one of the first physicians to come to El Paso to practice medicine, died this morning at the family residence, 121 West Overland street, after a lingering illness.

Dr. Irvin was intimately identified with the growth of El Paso. He was one of the first directors of the public schools of the city, one of the founders of the First Methodist church, and one of the most widely known old time citizens of El Paso.

Up to a few years ago, Dr. Irvin owned one of the most important drug firms in the city, located on South El Paso street.

Dr. Irvin was a practicing physician here for more than 29 years. For a long time he was division surgeon for the Santa Fe.

For the past few years he had retired from active practice of his profession, and Bright's disease had kept him confined to his bed for some time.

Dr. Irvin is survived by his son, Dr. H. H. Irvin, who is a practicing physician in El Paso; a sister living in Massachusetts, and a daughter.
