## OPERATION IS FATAL TO SON OF ALDERMAN

Riordan Jackson, son of Ald. H. P. Jackson, died at Johns Hopkins hospital in Baltimore at 4 a. m. today.

He was 17.

His father took him there in an effort to save his sight. Sight of one eye was almost gone. The trouble, it was feared, would affect the other eye seriously.

Miss Helen Jackson, daughter of the alderman, 907 Cincinnati, said that details of the cause of death were lacking. She said she thought that nerve trouble was the original cause of the eye trouble.

Friends of the family here said they thought doctors probably had attempted to remove the bad eye and that the shock was too great for the youth to withstand.

Jackson wired Lee Orndorff, his business partner, that he would start home with the body at the earliest moment; probably today.

The trip from Baltimore will

take about three days.
