

## WM. JENNINGS, RESIDENT FOR 15 YEARS, DIES

William Jennings, 74 years old, a resident of El Paso for the past 15 years, died Tuesday afternoon at his residence, 3804 Hueco street. He had been critically ill for a week, though failing in health for the past year.

Mr. Jennings founded the Jennings Construction and Engineering company and was at the head of the business for several years, only recently turning the management over to his son, W. J. Jennings.

Before coming to El Paso Mr. Jennings lived in Los Angeles. A widow, Mrs. Ethel Jennings; one son, W. J. Jennings, 1201 Williams street; a daughter, Mrs. Alfred F. Pegan, 4531 Pershing Drive; one sister, Miss Georgina Jennings, 3804 Hueco street, and a brother, Thomas Jennings, of Billerica, Mass, survive.

Mr. Jennings was a member of St. Clement's Episcopal church. Funeral services will be held at the residence Thursday afternoon. Rev. C. S. Sargent will officiate. Arrangements are under direction of the Simmons-Hartford company.

Mr. Jennings was one of the members of a commission appointed by mayor Jos. U. Sweeney to investigate the International Water company in 1909, which recommended the purchase of the plant by the city and its operation as a municipal undertaking. Other members of the commission were James G. McNary, the late Felix Martinez, Beverley G. Thomas and G. A. Martin.
