

Former El Paso Councilman Killed In Wreck Of Auto

An automobile trip to El Paso ended in the death of W. C. Jolly, 52, member of the El Paso city council in 1916-17, early Sunday near Fresno, Calif., when the car which he was driving figured in an accident, according to information received by relatives here.

Mr. and Mrs. Jolly and two others started on the automobile trip at 5 o'clock Sunday morning. A few miles out of Fresno the car struck either another car or a post, relatives had not been advised which.

Mr. Jolly was fatally injured and died in a Fresno hospital at 10 p. m. Sunday. It is not known whether other members of the party were injured.

Mr. Jolly, who was a contractor, moved to California in 1919 after being prominently identified with civic and political life in El Paso for a number of years. He served as councilman under mayor Tom Lea.

Mr. Jolly is survived by his widow, two sons, a daughter and two stepsons in California. Relatives here include his father, J. P. Jolly, 2130 Erie street, and a brother, Joe Jolly, of the lower valley.

Funeral services will be held in Fresno at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon with burial there.
