

MISS LULA JONES DIES; WAS PIONEER OF KINDERGARTENS

Miss Lula H. Jones, founder of the first kindergarten school in the state of Texas, died at Hotel Dieu Thursday afternoon at 5 o'clock. She had been ill for over two months. Miss Jones was about 60 years of age.

Miss Jones has been residing with Mrs. J. Y. Waddington at 901 E. Nevada street for the past eight years.

Came Here in 1892.

The veteran school teacher came to El Paso from St. Louis in 1892 and organized the public kindergarten. She taught the Alta Vista kindergarten last year.

Mrs. Waddington raised a fund to aid Miss Jones immediately after she became ill. Many of her former kindergarten pupils contributed to the fund.

Has No Known Relatives.

Miss Jones had no relatives living in El Paso. Her friends do not know where her relatives are at present.

Funeral Today.

Funeral services will be held from the chapel of J. J. Kaster this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery. The Rev. Fuller Swift, of the Church of St. Clement will officiate. The Robert E. Lee chapter of the Daughters of Confederacy, of which Miss Jones was a member, will attend the services in a body.

HOLD FUNERAL FOR EL PASO PIONEER SCHOOL TEACHER

Funeral services for Miss Lula H. Jones, pioneer kindergarten teacher, who died Thursday afternoon after an illness of several months, were held at 2:30 oclock Friday afternoon at the undertaking parlors at 110 North Campbell street. Rev. G. H. Higgins officiated, assisted by Rev. Fuller Swift. Burial was in Evergreen cemetery. Robert E. Lee chapter of the D. A. R. attended the services in a body.

Miss Jones had been in El Paso since 1892, coming here from St. Louis. She organized the first kindergarten in the state of Texas. She lived with Mrs. J. Y. Wadlington, of 901 East Nevada street for the past eight years.
