

# ILLNESS FATAL TO W. E. KELLER

## El Paso Businessman Dies In California After Eight Weeks

Will E. Keller, El Paso milling man, died today in a Los Angeles, Cal., hospital. He was 66.

Mr. Keller had been ill about eight weeks.

He was the owner of the Globe Fico flour mill and ice plant on the Smelter road. He built the plant in 1908.

Mr. Keller was president of the Globe Grain and Milling Co., which has a chain of mills and elevators on the Pacific coast; was a stockholder in the Harry Mitchell Brewing Co., a stockholder in the Southwestern Portland Cement Co., and a director in the El Paso National Bank.

Mr. Keller was a member of the El Paso Masonic Lodge No. 130 and belonged to the Los Angeles Shrine Temple and was a Knight Templar.

Survivors include his widow and three sons. Funeral arrangements were pending today but El Paso friends said that services probably will be held in Los Angeles.

Mr. Keller spent most of his time on the coast but maintained a residence in El Paso.

He was born in Mississippi but moved with his parents to the Southwest when a child.
