FUNERAL SERVICES FOR JOHN M. KELLY

Was Last Survivor of El Paso's Famous Baseball Team

John M. Kelly, one of the last survivors of the famous "El Paso Browns" baseball team, was buried today in Concordia Cemetery after funeral services at 9 a. m. from Immaculate Conception Church. He was 82.

Mr. Kelly played centerfield for several years during the 80's on the Browns. It was one of the best known baseball teams in this section of the country.

Mr. Kelly was a Spanish-American War veteran and served with Troop H of the Rough Riders with Theodore Roosevelt in Cuba. He was a scout for the American cavalry in the Philippine Islands for several syears.

He came to El Paso in 1881. In later years he was known to hundreds of El Pasoans as "Uncle John."

Survivors include a sister, Mrs. Agnes Hynes, Jacksonville, Fla.; three nephews and a niece.
