DR. KLUTZ IS LAIN TO REST

Remains of El Paso Martyr to Science Buried With Simple Ceremony.

Funeral services for Dr. W. C. Klutz, city health officer, who died early Thursday of typhus fever, contracted while attending a patient, were held at the J. J. Kaster parlors Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock. Rev. W. M. Fairley and Rev. Henry Koster officiated. A number of city officials as well as friends and relatives, attended. Mayor Tom Lea paid a warm tribute to the memory of the dead man. Profuse floral offerings covered the coffin. Burial was in the Masonic plot of Concordia cemetery. Dr. Klutz was a member of El Paso lodge 129, A. F. and A. M.

The University club, of which Dr. Klutz was a member, adopted resolutions of condolence at a special meeting Thursday afternoon. The resolutions, which were drafted by a committee composed of A. W. Norcop, J. H. Melbroom, Dr. Paul Gallagher and R. G. Chapman, voice the sorrow of the members at the physician's death, express sympathy for his family and relatives, and point to the high place he held in El Paso as a friend of the unfortunate, a public spirited citizen, and a distinguished member of his profession.

Resolutions on the death of Dr. Klutz will be passed by the El Paso County Medical society at its meeting on Monday night. It was announced Friday.
