

Adolph Krakauer Taken by Death

Adolph M. Krakauer of Chihuahua, Mexico, died today in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Joe M. Loewenstein, at 808 Crosby Street.

He was 73.

He was born in San Antonio in 1875. In 1896 he went to Chihuahua where he and his father, Max Krakauer, established a hardware store.

He later helped organize the Krakauer, Zork and Moyer Hardware Co. here. He remained president and general manager of his own store in Chihuahua, however, and opened a branch store in Cuattemoc, Chihuahua, in addition. His partnership with Zork and Moyer was dissolved in the 1920s.

He married Anita Enriquez of Chihuahua shortly after settling there. He was one of the founders and later president of the Rotary Club of Chihuahua City and was a member of the Foreign Club and Casino.

He is survived by four daughters, Mrs. Loewenstein of El Paso; Mrs. Edwin John Ryan and Minna Krakauer of Chihuahua; and Mrs. Phillips Doerr of Torreon, Mexico; a brother, Julius, of El Paso and four grandchildren.

He had been in an El Paso hospital and at the home of his daughter since Nov. 17.

The body will be forwarded to Chihuahua for burial by Harding and Orr Funeral Home.
