

KRAUSE FUNERAL RITES SATURDAY

Pioneer El Pasoan Dies At Home After Illness Of Three Days

Funeral services will be held in the Immaculate Conception church at 10 a. m. tomorrow for Charles A. Krause, 61, pioneer El Pasoan, who died yesterday at his home after an illness of three days. Rev. Fr. J. C. M. Garde will officiate. Burial will be in Concordia.

Mr. Krause came to El Paso in 1886 and worked at his trade of a printer with the old El Paso Herald until 1895, when he went into the bakery business.

He was one of the owners of the old Pioneer Bakery. Later he purchased an interest in the Belgian Bakery, which he operated until last year.

Mr. Krause formerly was chief of the Volunteer Fire Department. The banquet held Tuesday was the first he had missed.

He was born in San Antonio.

Mr. Krause and Miss Emma E. Gemoets was the first couple to be married in the Immaculate Conception church. They were married in 1895.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Emma E. Krause; three daughters, Mrs. S. E. Aguirre, Mexico, D. F.; Mrs. C. M. Priest, Long Beach, Calif., and Mrs. Virginia Trew, El Paso; and two sons, J. L., and C. J. Krause both of El Paso.
