

## Death Claims Mrs. Krause, City Pioneer

Mrs. Emma Krause, 72, of 2922 Louisville Street, a resident of El Paso the past 63 years and mother of Mrs. Stephen Aguirre, wife of the American consul in Juarez, died Thursday in an El Paso hospital.

Mrs. Krause came to El Paso with her parents from Belgium, in 1883. Her father established one of the city's first bakeries.

She later married Charles A. Krause, one of El Paso's first fire chiefs, who was head of the department when it was a volunteer unit. He died in 1934.

Mrs. Krause had recently suffered a stroke en route to El Paso from California.

In addition to Mrs. Aguirre Mrs. Krause is survived by two other daughters, Mrs. Clarence Priest, Long Beach, Calif., and Mrs. Lee Hillis, El Paso; two sons Joseph I. Krause, Denver, and C. J. (Bill) Krause, El Paso; eight grandchildren; two brothers, Leon Gemoets, El Paso, and Joseph Gemoets, WALTERIA, Calif.; and one sister, Mary Adeline, Webster Grove, Mo.

Rosary services will be held at 8 p. m. Friday in Kaster and Maxon Chapel, with the Rev. R. T. Gaul officiating. Funeral arrangements were pending with Kaster and Maxon Funeral Home.
