

Pioneer Woman Taken by Death

Mrs. Flora Krause, widow of the late Ernest Krause, pioneer El Paso architect, who died in 1932, died yesterday in her home at 908 North Stanton street. She was 85.

Mrs. Krause moved into the house on North Stanton street on New Year's Day, 1883, as a bride. She had been married to Mr. Krause in Gonzales the preceding December. The house was the first north of the railroad tracks.

She was the oldest member of the First Presbyterian Church in years of membership, having joined in 1883. She was born in Robinson, Ill., on Feb. 2, 1860. Her family moved to Texas when she was 12.

Mr. Krause built the first section of Hotel Dieu. He built Hart's Dam in 1883.

Survivors are three daughters, Mrs. Mabel Montfort and Mrs. Preston B. Ball of El Paso and Mrs. Earl E. Sidebottom of Los Angeles, five grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. Funeral arrangements are pending with Hagedorn-Harding Funeral Home.

Mrs. Flora Kraus, Pioneer, Is Dead

Mrs. Flora Krause, 85, died in her home, 906 North Stanton Street, late Thursday. She is an El Paso pioneer, having come here as a bride New Year's Day, 1883. Her husband was the late Ernest Krause, pioneer architect of El Paso, who built Hotel Dieu and Harts Dam in 1883 for the Mexican government.

She was a member of the Trinity Methodist Church, and from point of years of membership, was the oldest member of that church, having affiliated herself with the church in April, 1883.

She is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Earl E. Sidebottom, Los Angeles; Mrs. Mabel Montfort, El Paso, and Mrs. Preston B. Ball, El Paso. Funeral arrangements were pending with the Hagedon-Harding Funeral Home.
