

DEATH TAKES E. P. PIONEER IN CALIFORNIA

Mrs. Haymon Krupp Dies
In Los Angeles
Hospital

WAS ILL SIX WEEKS

Wife of Manufacturer Gave
Liberally to Charity
For Many Years

Mrs. Haymon Krupp, philanthropist, died today at 12:45 a. m. in a Los Angeles, Calif., hospital. El Paso relatives were advised.

She had been in the Cedars of Lebanon hospital in Los Angeles for six weeks.

Her husband, president of Haymon Krupp & Co., clothing manufacturers, and their son, M. Bernhard Krupp, secretary-treasurer of the company, are in Los Angeles.

A daughter, Mrs. Leland Hazelton Hewitt, today was en route to California from Washington, D. C. Another daughter, Mrs. H. James Stone, lives in Brockton, Mass.

Donated To Charities

Mrs. Krupp and her husband gave liberally to El Paso charities.

She was a pioneer resident.

She was a member of both Temple Mt. Sinai and B'nai Zion congregations.

Mrs. Krupp also was a member of Eastern Star, Woman's club, Temple Sisterhood, Council of Jewish Women, and El Paso Jewish Relief society.

Born In New York

She was born in New York City and had lived in El Paso 32 years on May 1. She was 53 years old.

Besides her husband and children, Mrs. Krupp is survived by her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Silverman, New York City; three sisters, Mrs. Pearl Gross, Utica, N. Y.; Mrs. Rose Caruso, Los Angeles, and Mrs. Miriam Jacobson, New York City, and a brother, Sam Silverman, Miami, Fla.
