

C. H. LADD PASSES AWAY AT HIS HOME

Charles Havens Ladd, superintendent of construction for the Stone-Webster Engineering corporation, died this morning at 3 o'clock at his home, on Arizona street. Mr. Ladd was 38 years old. He had been in poor health for a number of years.

He came to El Paso from Fort Worth a little over two years ago as superintendent of construction of the Stone & Webster corporation and had been with the company for 10 years in Houston, Fort Worth and El Paso. He built the interurban between El Paso and Ysleta and since that time had been in charge of all construction work in El Paso, including the new extension of the power plant.

Surviving Mr. Ladd are his widow, four brothers, William Ladd, Frederick Chester Ladd, Carolyn Willis Ladd and Jack Van R. Ladd, who lives in New York city, and a sister, Mrs. A. Edgar Smith, who lives in Marlin, Tex.

The funeral service will be held Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock from the church of St. Clement and the burial will be in Evergreen cemetery. Rev. Henry Easter will conduct the service.

Mr. Ladd was well known to El Paso's professional and young business men. He had a large number of friends among the mining men of the southwest and Mexico and was one of the most popular officials of the Stone & Webster organization in El Paso.
