

## Rites Pending For Mrs. Edith Lane

Mrs. Edith Phelan Lane of 817 Myrtle avenue died yesterday at her home. She lived in El Paso 49 years.

Mrs. Lane came to El Paso as a correspondent for Harpers Magazine to cover the Mexican revolution in 1910. Later she became publicity agent for Pancho Villa and followed the Mexican rebel leader through his campaigns with her mother along as chaperone.

She traveled widely in other parts of the world and made several European trips. She was a member of the El Paso County Historical Society, El Paso County Humane Society and the Pioneer Assn.

Mrs. Lane was a member of the Texas Womens Writers Assn. She was active in community, civic and church affairs. There are no known survivors. Funeral arrangements are pending with Rodehaver-Miller Funeral Home.
