Death Takes El Paso Mining And Railroad Man

Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 4 p. m. in Peak-Hagedorn Chapel for William Bently Langston, who died yesterday noon at his home, 915 N. Lee St.

Mr. Langston was 63.
